- (4) Make yourself familiar with the correct traffic signals, so that if you are in the lead, or rear of a group, you can give them correctly, & in ample time for them to be seen by members of your own party, or approaching vehicles.
 - (5) Obey all traffic signals & road signs, whether riding or wheeling your cycle, & give way to all pedestrians at crossings not controlled by police or traffic signals.
- (6) Warnings by ringing bells, must only be sounded when absolutely ne-cessary by the leading riders of a group only.

'CYCLING SECTION'.

CLUB RULES.

- (1) Obey your Captain, who has the authority & responsibility of controll; ing the Club, from the moment it assembles to the dispersal after a run.
- (2) When assembling in the street before a run, help to maintain order & preserve a reasonable state of quie tness.
- (3) Club formation [which is two abreast must be kept to whilst riding unless there is sufficient reason for breaking same, or the Captain's order be given.
- (7) The 'inside' rider must keep as near to the left as is practicable, un-less about to overtake, or turn to the right.
- (8) Give proper attention to the condition of your cycle, remember the whole Club may be delayed by one member with a 'patched up' cycle, or an uncomfortable riding position.
- (9) Do not mistake a Club run for a training spin; keep with the party until the conclusion of the run, unless you have sufficient reason for not doing so, in which case first advise the captain.
- (10) Treat other road users, as you would have them treat you; be cort-eous, set a good example of road sense, & be proud of being a Club cyclist.
- (11) Apply these rules to your every day cycling, & take the good advice they contain.
